Residence Hall Services

Cable Television: Each room has one Cable TV hookup. Basic cable channels are provided at no cost. Residents need to provide a co-axial cable wire and TV. Cable TV is also provided in the main lounge of each hall/area.

Furnishings: All rooms are furnished with beds, mattresses, dressers, closets, and overhead lighting. Furniture may not be removed from the room. Students may bring their own micro fridge to campus. It is the student's responsibility to clean their apartment throughout and at the end of each semester.

Laundry Facilities: Each student apartment is equipped with a washer and dryer – quarters not required.

Computers: Residence halls have Internet and e-mail access. Students may bring their own laptop or desktop computer.
