



Job Title: Summer for Success – Peer Mentors/Interns

Dates: July 5 – August 1, 2022

Compensation:

Position Overview: Summer for Success aims to give college-bound students who learn differently the skills, confidence and preparation to successfully transition from high school. Through academic and residential programming, students work towards increasing self-awareness, problem-solving, and social pragmatic skills to proactively determine the optimal college environment.

Summer for Success has an opening for the position for 4-(four) **Peer Mentors/Interns**. This internship position will work with students in and out of the classroom by supporting all programmatic efforts. As pivotal members of the team, Peer Mentors will help students increase engagement in the program and assist in efforts to ensure the program runs smoothly. Peer Mentors report directly to the Senior Coordinator of Summer Programming, the Academic Coordinator and Residence Life Coordinator, as well as other Summer for Success administrators and staff.

Primary Functions:

- Residing in on-campus housing and assisting in the implementation of a residence life program.
- Providing supervision in the student Residence Hall(s) to ensure a safe learning and living environment.
- Participation in all aspects of the program, including assisting in the classes, independent living courses, social clubs, activities, and other required events.
- Assist in student independent-living skills development.
- Attend all assigned meetings plus a 3-day pre-program training workshop.
- Participate in weekly training opportunities to enhance professional development.
- Facilitate opening day activities (July 10).
- Attend the final ceremonial dinner (July 28).

- Communicate any student-related issues to direct supervisors.
- Understand all program policies, expectations, and procedures.
- Collect student data on a daily basis or as directed, in order to inform end-of-program evaluations.
- All other duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Current college students pursuing a bachelor's degree in Education, Psychology, Human Services, or other related fields. Student is recommended to have completed two-years of college coursework.
- Ability to work independently and in groups.
- Eager to actively engage in professional development and other practical learning opportunities.
- Comfortable with student-centric residential models and flexible work hours.
